

Dermopigmentation should not be used in some cases and needs a medical advice

An unstabilized inflammatory scar

Evolving dermatological diseases, infectious diseases.

Chronic skin disease.

Eye disorders or irritations.

Autoimmune diseases, although the pigment is inert.

Major systemic disorders (highly dependent diabetes mellitus, severe allergies, Renal, hepatic or cardiac insufficiency ...)

Tendency to develop keloids.

Treatment with acid vitamin A (Isotretinoin)

Some unstable and undecided psychological profiles (permanent character of pigmentation).

Immunocompromised patients (AIDS, kidney transplants, immune deficiency, etc.)

It should be noted that patients under anti-coagulants (Aspirin), Anti-inflammatories may be prone to hematoma, bruising or localized bleeding to the implantation area.

In case of a history of herpes, it is necessary to take a specific treatment before a lip pigmentation.

Due to a possible interaction of the pigment with injections of filling (wrinkles, increase of lips ...) it is advisable to wait two months in between.

Avoid:

Any exfoliating product containing Retinol A or glycolic acid and any makeup or foundation product on the treated area.

Very warm showers and prolonged baths. For the bath or shower, apply beforehand, a generous layer of cream or and keep your face away from the shower head.

Avoid soaps, creams and lotions on the treated area. Wash and apply only on the surrounding area, carefully avoiding the pigmented area.

No swimming, saunas or Jacuzzi for a period of 5 to 7 days.

Avoid alcohol abuse as it could cause a much greater swelling.

Avoid sun or uv until complete healing

Do not touch, rub or scratch the treated area as this may cause poor healing and / or loss of color pigments.

Do not touch the treated area except to apply vaselinated salves or ointments

APPLY ONE OR TWO HOURS BEFORE PIGMENTATION AN ANESTESIAN CREAM ORDERED BY YOUR DOCTOR (EMLA CREAM)

APPLY AT LEAST TWICE A DAY BISPETINE TO DESINFECT and a typical healing cream Homeoplasmine / cicalphate / bepanthen ointment or cream sold by your esthetician.

NB Any important inflammatory or allergic observation accompanied or not with an infection must be the subject of a medical consultation.

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
